Cox Cable will have a representative come and explain the process for the Digital TV transition. Between February 17 and June 12, 2009, TV will change. You may have heard of the Digital Transition and wonder what it means to you.

What is the Digital Transition? It's the time when the local over-the-air broadcast stations, like ABC, CBS, and NBC, are required to switch from analog to digital signals. If you have a TV that uses an antenna (rabbit ears or rooftop) to receive a TV signal, and is not connected to Cable, you may not be able to receive your favorite shows when the change takes place.




Sam Giordano is the new leader for the Genealogy SIG. She would like for anyone to help her with the SIG. Please contact Sam.

How-to-Workshop

What do you use your computer for?

Do you like the challenge of building a computer from parts or finding out what great information is on Google?

Do you know what an ad-hoc network is? It is a Lan network that is built at same time as devices connect. Instead of relying on

a base station to control the flow of messages to each node of the network, the individual network nodes forward packets to each other.

In the windows operating system, ad-hoc is a communication mode (setting) that allows computers to directly connect to each other without a router.

You can visit the University of Washington's website (<http://www.cs.washington.edu/research/edtech/presenter/doc/adhoc.html>) and learn how to set up this system step by step.



Ubuntu released 8.10 version in November. Ubuntu has advantages over other distributors in that it has a large selection of ready to install software packages. It also has a large community following to help provide information and support.

In March, Ubuntu released 9.04 beta version. This version brings faster boot

speeds and a new notification system. It will also let you play with cloud computing. The code name for this version is “Jaunty Jackalope.”

Zoom in and Out

You can use the Scroll Button on your mouse to zoom in and out in documents quickly. Just hold down the Control key and roll the scroll wheel forward or back. You can enlarge or shrink the text quickly.

More File Options

If you hold down the Shift key while selecting the File Menu in Word (or composing a message in Outlook), the menu options change. You get hand options to Save All and Close All open files. In Excel, you get a Close All—but not a Save All option.

Line Breaks Without Bullets

When you are creating a bulleted list in Word, you might want to have an item without a bullet by pressing Shift-Enter. The next time you press the Enter key, the new line will continue the bulleted list.

Helping Hands

Display the Traditional Desktop Icons in XP

Older versions of Windows had a few icons that always appeared on the desktop: My Documents; My Computer, My Network Places, Internet Explorer and Recycle Bin. Of these only the Recycle Bin appears in default in XP. If you want to display any of the other icons, do this: Right click anywhere on the desktop. Make sure it is on the desktop itself and not an object. Windows displays a Context Menu. Choose Properties. The display Properties Menu springs into view. On the Desktop tab, click the Customize Desktop button.

Windows displays the Desktop Items dialog box with the General tab selected. At the top of the dialog box, select the boxes corresponding to the icons you want displayed on the desktop. Conversely, you can deselect the check boxes of any icons you don't want displayed. Keep clicking OK to dismiss all of the dialog boxes on the screen.

The icons you selected should be visible on the screen.

Cadillac gets WI-FI


In car WI-FI came to the US last year for selected models of Chrysler vehicles. General Motors will soon start integrating a similar model called Cadillac WI-FI by Autonet with its luxury Cadillac sedans.

Chrysler and Cadillac are equipped with internet con-

nectivity utilizing the Autonet Mobile in-car router, a hardware specifically designed and ruggedized for use in moving vehicles. As long as this cellular router remains within the service's coverage area, it turns the vehicle into a mobile WI-FI hotspot to connect laptops and other devices in the car.

There is a \$29 monthly fee for internet access. The routers are also available in the after market purchase for about \$499.

Let's hope drivers remember to drive and not surf the net while driving. Maybe the internet will have a program to avoid hitting cars!



Windows Developers

Windows 7

The beta version introduces a collection of new features to improve how users discover and use devices connected to their PC,

Windows 7 introduces a new folder that is named the Devices and Printers, through which users can see all the

devices connected to their PC.

Device Stage provides a new way for users to interact with their cell phones, cameras, printers, and portable media players on their desktop.

Windows 7 will also provide improvements to the Windows Plug and Play infra-

structure that supports detecting and grouping various functions that a device supports.

Our May 7th General meeting will be about Windows 7. So mark your calendars to be at this meeting!
