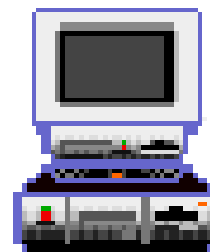

Special Committee

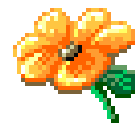
At this month's LVPCUG Board meeting, a motion was made to form a committee to discuss the future of the club. We are asking for volunteers to review information on continuing the club.

General Meeting—May 7th (Thursday instead of Wednesday)

Windows 7

John Fischer will present information on the new Windows 7 that Microsoft will be releasing in 2010.

Microsoft has been working on creating a new operating system but has been very secretive about what will be in it.

The beta version has been released and being tested. It will be a full OS release and will come in both 32-bit and 64-bit versions. There may be changes to the desktop which will primarily deal with making shortcuts more accessible and manageable.

Not sure it's safe to remove a device? The Windows 7 beta version includes the standard "safely remove hardware" functionality, plus an eject option in the context menu. In the Release Candidate,

Microsoft will combine these two options and re-name it "Eject". The Tool Notification Area icon still appears, but its context menu now has the option to open devices and printers.

Microsoft has also restored the "add legacy hardware" functionality to help add non-plug and play devices.

John will tell us of the many new features and upgrades. It will be very informative. Be sure to put this meeting on your calendar.

The meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 7th, at the West Charleston Library (Charleston east of Torrey Pines). The meeting starts at 6:15 p.m.

AVAST. It is also a free-
ware and has over 80 mil-

lion users. It can be found at www.avast.com. With AVAST, you register the download and receive a key that is good for 1 year. Then you have to re-do the registration.

A free Spyware program is Ad-Aware. This program has received numerous awards and can be downloaded at www.lavasoft.com.

What is Twitter and how do you Tweet?

Twitter is a new social network site that answers the question "What are you doing"? Members of Twitter will go to their site and type in a comment such as "I am reading the new book, Twilight".

The statement can only be 140 characters or less. The message is then sent by

email, phone, or instant messenger to friends and family.

The whole idea of Twitter is to share what you are doing or finding out what other people are doing.

Twitter lets you write and read brief updates on anything. The way people use Twitter has grown., Celebrities and politicians use it to contact their fans. News organizations such as CBS

use it to send regular updates on the news.

Twitter is a free service and easy to get started. You will need a user name. Try to use a variation of your original name so people will know who they are messaging.

Twitter is a real community. To have the most fun, be yourself and enjoy.



Linux/Open Source



The next version of the popular Ubuntu **Linux** distribution is due out on April 23rd.

Ubuntu is not only a superior and free operating system, but it is bundled with many open source (free) applications.

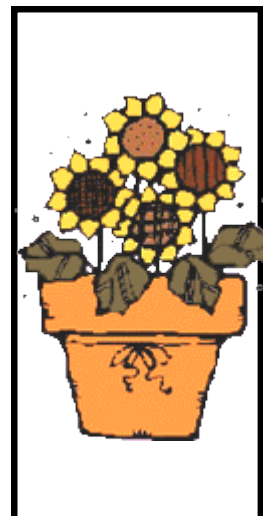

Why update your drivers?

It is drivers that power the devices in or attached to our computer. It is important to check the drivers at least once a year and update them.

Your devices may not work properly or at all if they do not have updates on a regular basis.

There are lots of reasons why you need to keep your device drivers updated, but the simplest one is that if you do not do so, the device may just stop working

because of the bug repairs and updates that do not have the proper drivers. Device drivers are something that you should stay up on.

WIFI Hot Spots

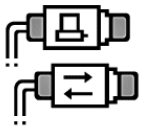
You can take advantage of Public WIFI hot spots or start a wireless network in your home. The first thing you need to do is to make sure your computer has the right gear. Most new laptops and newer desktops come with built-in transmitters. If your laptop does not have the right equipment, you can buy a wireless adapter to plug into the USB port.

Once the adapter is installed and drivers checked, the computer should automati-

cally start and discover any hotspot in the area. The computer will inform you of the existence of a network and ask whether you want to connect to it.

You can then access the internet, your email, website or favorites.

Having a home wireless network, allows you to easily connect several computers and to easily move the computers from spot to spot.
