Tips & Tricks

What can I do when my computer freezes?

If your computer is on and the program you are in freezes, press CTRL-ALT-DELETE and click the Start Task Manager. If the status column shows that the program is not responding, select/highlight that program and click End Task. Sometimes it takes a few minutes to stop the program. If that doesn't work, go to the Start button (lower left) and press Restart on the Shut Down button. As a last resort press and hold the power button on your CPU until it shuts down. Wait at least 10 seconds to restart your system.
