How to Create a System Image with Windows 8.1

A previous tip showed how to create a system image in Windows 8. In Windows 8.1, Microsoft changed the procedure and made it harder to find. In this tip, I will give the new way to make a system image.

As the previous tip described, an obscure feature called "Windows 7 File Recovery" for creating system images was tucked away in Windows 8. That applet is gone from Windows 8.1 but the same functionality is still there with a different name. It is found in the feature called "File History" that was described in this other tip. The function has the new name "System Image Backup" and here are the steps to access it.
