This article has been updated multiple times since its initial publication. The most recent update was September 5, 2019, and includes details about important changes that were effective with version 1903.

With Windows 10, Microsoft has completely rewritten the Windows Update rule book. For expert users and IT pros accustomed to having fine-grained control over the update process, these changes might seem wrenching and even draconian.

You can't pick and choose which updates to install? There's no option to delay updates on PCs running Windows 10 Home? Upgrades to new versions are mandatory?

[How to Troubleshoot Printing Issues in Microsoft Word](#)



here's nothing more frustrating than working endless hours on a document only to be greeted with an error message when it's time to print. Here are a few suggestions to get Word to work with your printer again.

Basic Checks

First, it's a good idea to do some basic hardware checks to ensure everything is hooked up as it should be.

Here are a few things to check before we look at Word:

Make sure the USB cable that connects your PC to your printer is hooked up properly. If your printer is wireless, make sure it's turned on.

Double-check the internet connection (wired or wireless).

Make sure the printer is plugged in and turned on.

See if there's a paper jam.

Ensure your printer is compatible with your computer. Search Google and the printer manufacturer's website for more information.

These might seem like obvious things to check, but they're also easy to forget. It's always best to try the basics first and avoid wasting time unnecessarily.
